Biography

Anneliese Everts was born in 1908 in Solingen-Widdert, Germany.

She spent her life devoted to her paintings, one among many artists in West Germany who brought vibrancy and poetry to the post-World War II landscape.

Kind of unusual for a single woman at that time she travelled a lot around Europe, mostly around the Mediterranean, Italy, Austria and Switzerland. Drawings and watercolours from these journeys are the basic themes of her oil paintings. In her description of a series of watercolours "Steine und Licht" ("Stones and Light") from her travels in southern France in 1960 she says "the rock can't block the infinite expression of light and its "kostbare Farben" - invaluable colours."

Anneliese Everts was trained in painting and sculpturing at the "Fachschule für Metallgestaltung, Solingen" and had private lessons with her teacher the painter Eichenberg. For a living she worked at the city council from 1925-1937, as a freelancer at the newspaper "Solinger Tageblatt" and as a graphic designer.

1937-1939 she studied at Folkwangschule Essen and at the Art School in Munich.

1946 member of diverse art clubs and associations and participation of annual exhibitions: "Bergische Kunstgenossenschaft Wuppertal", 1947 "Gemeinschaft Solinger Künstler". 1946 "Federation of Artists North Rhine-Westphalia", 1955 "GEDOK Köln", "Düsseldorfer Künstlerinnen e.V." 1954 – 1963 Assistant at Klingenmuseum Solingen. 1966 she works at the "Fachschule für Metallgestaltung, Solingen". 1967 deceased in Solingen.
